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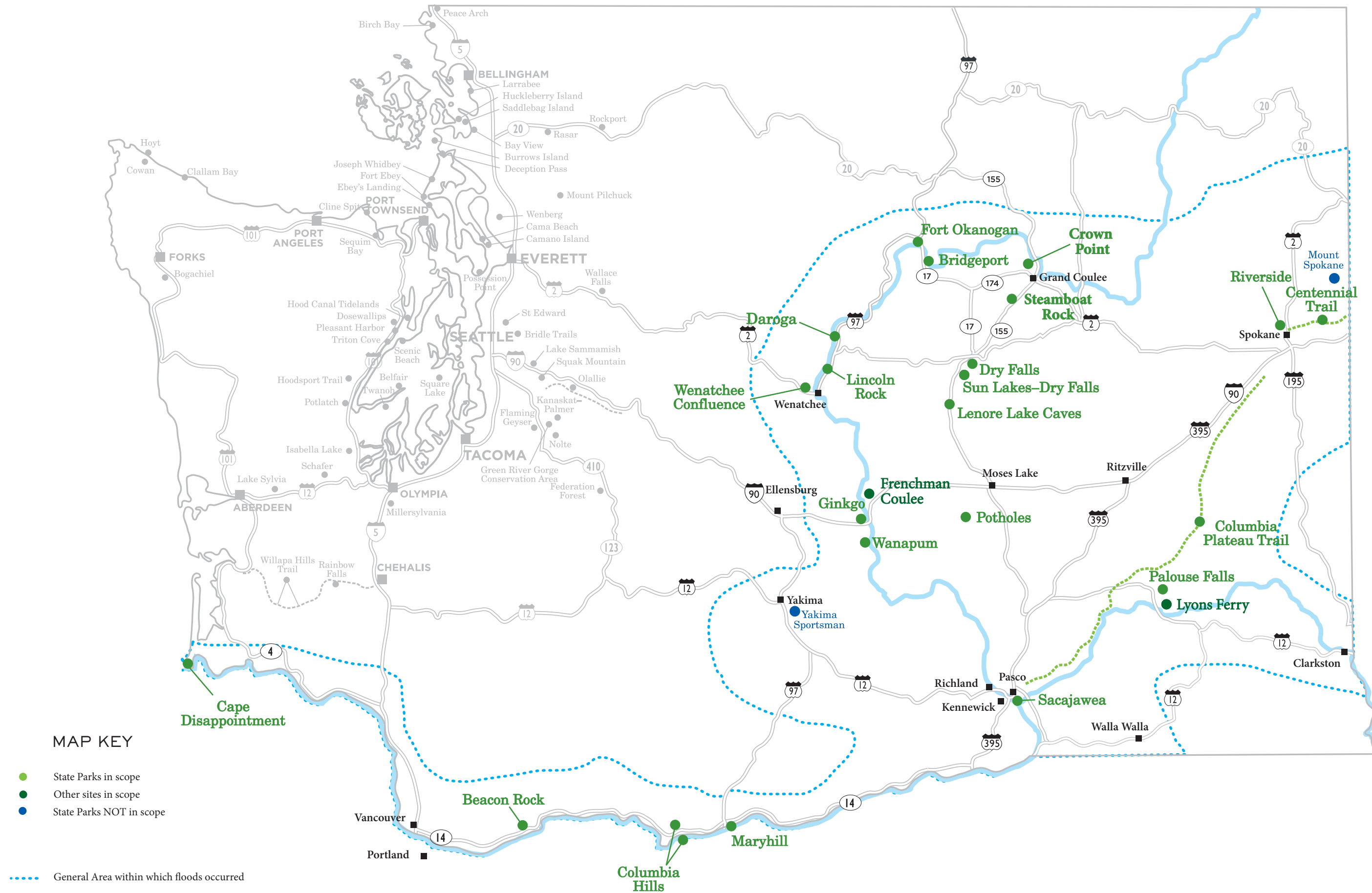


Figure 1: Project Sites for WSPRC Ice Age Floods Interpretive Plan

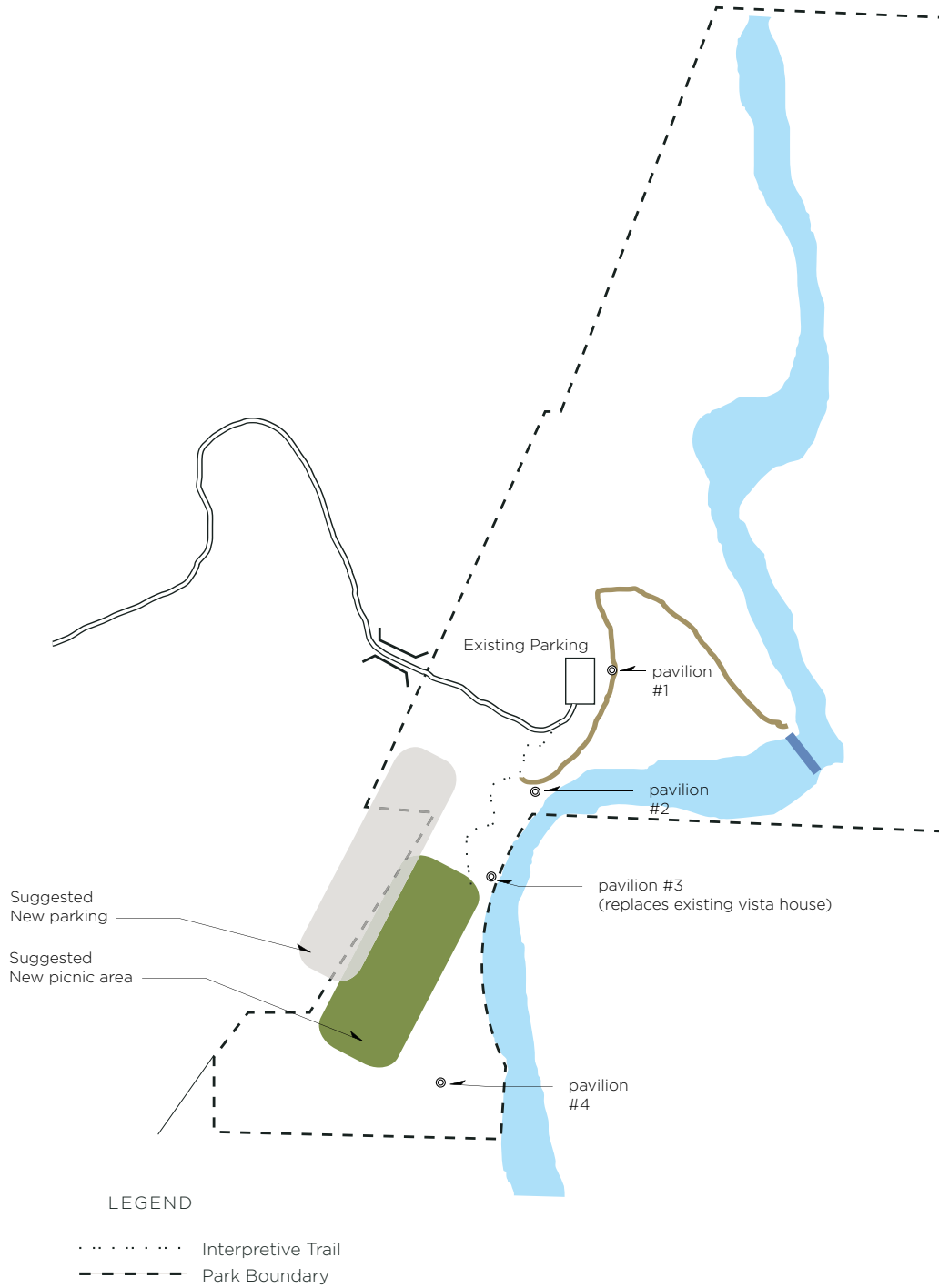
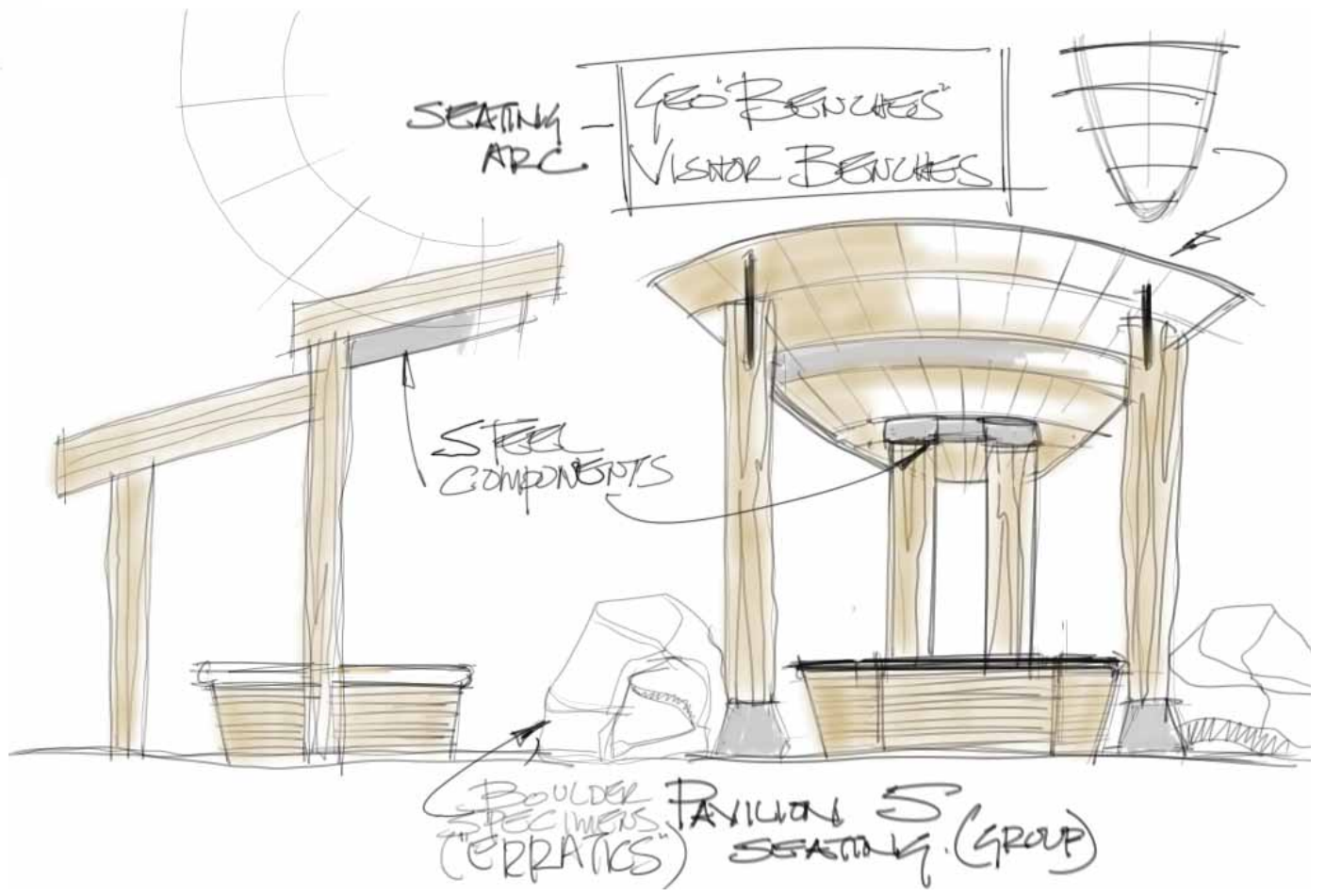
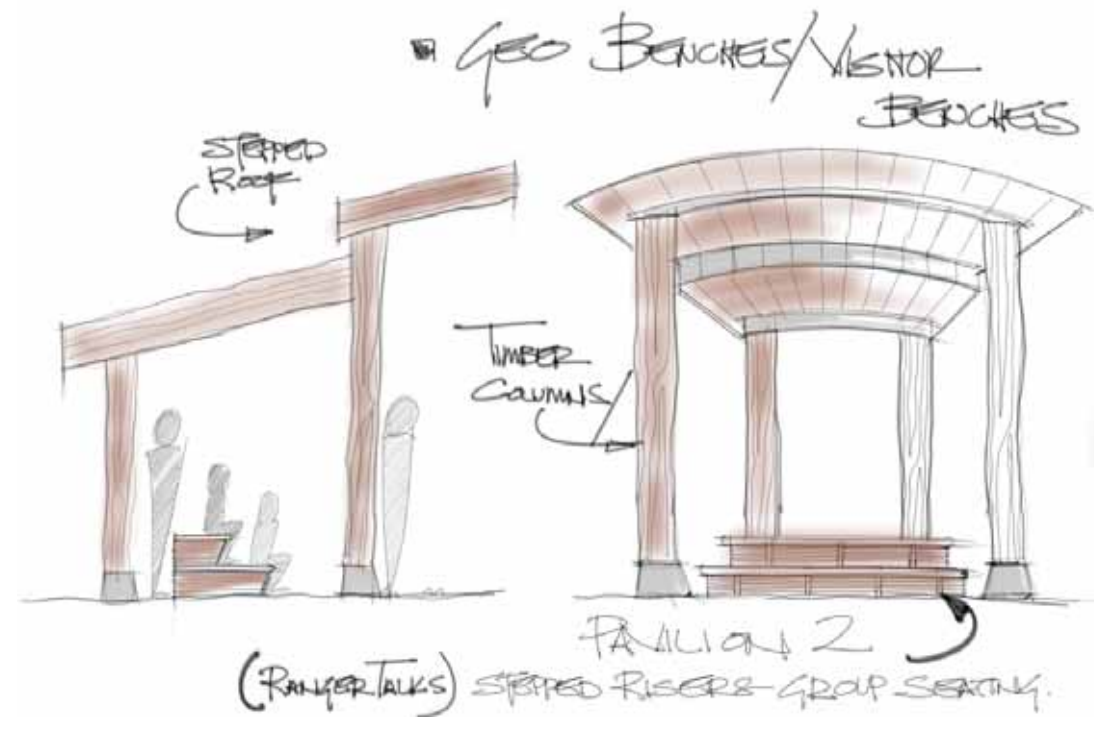


Figure 8: Site Map: Palouse Falls

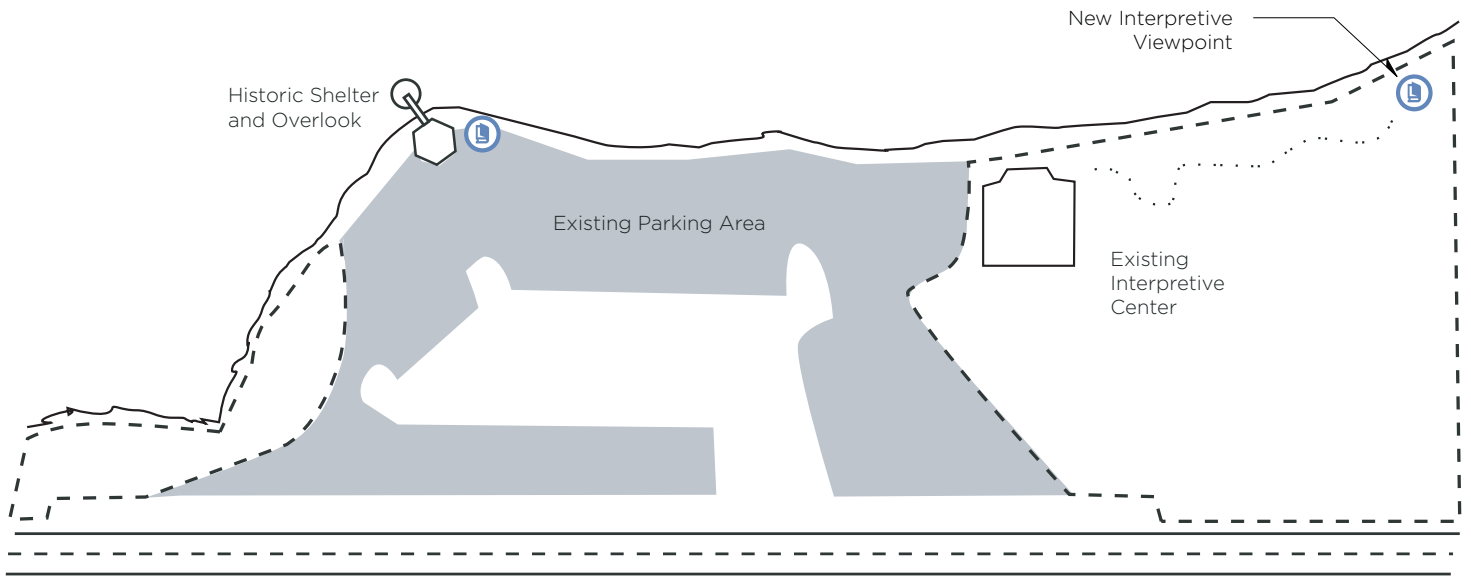


Note: Providing designs and even sketches for pavilions was outside the scope of the contract, but several reviewers wanted to know what the pavilions might look like. Consequently, we prepared rough concept sketches of what a pavilion might look like. They are not intended to be recommendations but rather possibilities that exhibit the basic characteristics we are recommending, which are:

- Open air
- Sheltered from the sun and rain
- A design to match the characteristics of the environment (stepped as the stepped layers of basalt along the canyon walls)

The sketches as a whole indicate modifications for seating, interpretive panels, and presentations. Also, two different roof designs are noted.
