Ocean Beach Approach parking lot, between 8 a.m. and 11 a.m.</p>	<p>Basic Safety Guidelines:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ Wear gloves, proper clothing, and water-resistant shoes. ▶ Do not touch medical waste, dead animals, hazardous materials or sharp objects. If you are uncertain about an item, do not touch it. ▶ Do not approach wildlife. ▶ Report hazardous items that cannot be removed to event staff. ▶ Work with a partner. ▶ Be careful of unstable banks, steep slopes, or slippery surfaces. ▶ Do not try to lift anything that is too heavy for you. Ask for help! ▶ Watch for poison oak, plants with thorns, or other natural hazards. ▶ Watch for any trucks or equipment that might be used in the project. 	<p>Check In Time and Location Please check in before beginning any cleanup activities. On-site registration, orientation and instructions will be provided upon arrival.
