Dear Mr. Scannon:

Thank you for your letter of May 14. I appreciate the cooperation which you have given us in the past and see no reason why you cannot give your relatives and very close friends a key to the gate, providing it is used only by these people. I know you will agree that we must be careful to keep out these who would do a considerable amount of damage both to your property and ours. I know, because of your past support of our park, that you will be very careful to see that the keys do not get into the hands of these who should not have them.

At our Historic Sites Committee meeting in Ellensburg last weekend I met Dr. Gunther and Earl Swanson of the University of Washington Department of Anthropology. They were discussing a very interesting work which they would like to do on our property and I believe a portion on the property which you own. Would it be possible for you to reconsider your decision as to their research on your property as I believe this is a very important project to the University and I know they have gone to considerable trouble to allocate the necessary funds to carry on this work. I would appreciate anything you might go to assist in this rerearch.



# What is CAMP and why do we need it?

Classification and Management Plan (CAMP)

CAMP Products include:

- Land Classification which involves zoning or classification of park lands
- Long-Term Boundary this looks at the big picture of lands surrounding the park
- Management Plan describes the principal features of the park, sets park-wide management objectives and outlines specific approaches and prescriptions in response to issues identified through the planning process.



### **CAMP and EIS progress**


<u>Where we left off:</u> Stage 1 & 2: Completed. First draft of alternatives developed. Stage 3 Preferred Alternative: Project put on hold

### Current Status:

- Tribal Outreach October 2023
- Planning update to Kittitas County on October 16<sup>th</sup> 2024
- Onboarding EIS Consultant in January 2024
- EIS site visit in March 2024
- EIS public scoping/meeting slated for May 2024
- Drafting EIS Analysis Dec 2023- Oct 2024
- Preferred Alternative and drafting CAMP document

 $\geq$  Informs the public about the development and engineering of the built environment.

Reveals details about the environmental health and development of a specific area in a comprehensive report.

# What will the Ginkgo EIS Analyze?


- The EIS will analyze four different alternatives for Recreation Drive Trail.
- We must understand the impacts of partially or fully limiting vehicular use to natural, cultural, and recreational resources.
- Once defined, an EIS consultant will facilitate our public process.

The EIS will take approximately 10-12 months to complete
